The suggested length for articles is 250 to 300 words. Please feel free to include links to the author websites, YouTube videos of authors reading the book, or other useful links. However, please note that we will not use links for purchasing merchandise.

Also, please note that the publication schedule will be slightly different as we reboot the content. The July issue will be sent out in the first week of July and all future newsletters will follow that schedule, rather than being published at the end of the month. The due date for time-sensitive submissions for each issue will be the 15th of the previous month, e.g., July 15th for the August issue.
