
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#### Illinois Reads Book Review

#### Grade K - 2


You Are a Story by Bob Raczka is a thought-provoking children's book that celebrates the unique and interconnected nature of all beings. Using rhymes and vibrant illustrations, Raczka invites readers of all ages to explore their own stories and the stories of others.

The central message is that everyone is a story, shaped by their experiences, relationships, and dreams. Raczka uses metaphors, such as a book, a puzzle, and a song, to illustrate this concept. *You Are a Story* is a valuable tool for educators in several ways. It could be used with multiple grade levels to spark discussions



This amazing story celebrates individuality and the power of storytelling, making this Illinois Reads book a great beginning of the year read aloud.

## What are you reading?





# December 4, 2024 ~ Kelly B. Cartwright Why Don't My Best (Word) Readers Comprehend Text? Reading Science to Support Self-Regulated Comprehension



Some students seem to have the necessary skills they need to be good readers, yet still struggle with putting all of these things together in order to comprehend texts. In this session, we will look beyond these familiar skills to explore essential thinking skills, called executive skills, that support successful word reading and reading comprehension. Executive skills are self-regulatory skills that help students manage their thoughts, emotions, actions, and involve things like working memory, self-control, and mental flexibility.
